We are all in awe of what one of our newer and younger students has accomplished in such a short amount of time! Abigail enrolled in April and just turned one in June. She has some significant health issues, but that doesn't hold her back from smiling and enjoying life! When Abigail first arrived she was very unsure of her new surroundings and felt challenged by the new activities she was being introduced to by her teachers and therapists. For the first few weeks in our care, Abigail benefited from the Shared Therapy Program. Despite feeling unsure at first, she has become a rock star in a short amount of time! Although she is skeptical when a new skill is introduced, she quickly masters it and is ready for the next challenge. This little girl who had to be supported when sitting when she started, is now sitting independently and reaching for objects! She tolerates kneeling, is using her arms more and babbling

A note from Nurse Janice: Parents Summer Safety Tips: Have Fun and Be Smart !

Anybody can be at risk for a heat-related illness, especially in Florida. Take extra breaks and drink lots of water! The best way to avoid a heat-related illness is to limit exposure outdoors during hot days. Air conditioning is the best way to cool off, according to the CDC. Also:

Drink more liquid than you think you need! Wear loose, lightweight/light colored clothing and a hat Replace salt lost from sweating by drinking fruit juice or sports drinks Avoid spending too much time outdoors during the hottest part of the day, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Wear sunscreen; sunburn affects the body's ability to cool itself

Pay attention to the heat index

• Every pool, every lake and every warm summer day holds the possibility of new, fun summer experiences. All you need to add is your undivided attention when your child is in or near water!

Never leave your child alone; if you have to leave, take your child with you

Lifeguards aren't babysitters; always keep your eyes on your child!! Don't let children play around drains and suction fittings Always make sure everyone is wearing U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jackets while on a boat Don't underestimate the power of water; even rivers and lakes can have undertows



- Find age-appropriate swim lessons for your child, but keep in mind that lessons do not make your child
